Now Brother Knights please give our guests and rulers a rousing welcome.

Well Brother Knights, today marks the end of my Fifth Year as your Provincial Prior. In the past this would have required me to apply to have my Patent extended but now it is granted at the M E & S Grand Master's pleasure. In the last 168 years there have been eleven Provincial Priors of this old Province with Major Cuthbert Leicester-Warren (the 4th Prior) serving for 31 years and Major George Cornwall Leigh (the 2nd Prior) serving for 26 years. If I emulate Major Leicester-Warren I will be 108.

In managing this Province I have always tried to have a clear plan and a Plan B. At one point this year I was down to Plan D. At this meeting last year E Kt Peter Carroll retired as Vice Chancellor and I was pleased to appointed E Kt Simon Richardson to succeed him. However, in October, I was advised by the Craft Province that Simon was to be an APGM and would have to give up his Provincial role with the KT at short notice. I thank Simon for his efforts and wish him well in his new position. I was able to find a willing replacement in E Kt Peter Butler but this left me short of a Deputy Marshal. Being aware that E Kt Bill Caren, resplendent today in his new regalia as a PGtAdeC, would be retiring I made a mid year appointment to that post but unfortunately my chosen Officer could not take up the appointment due to a very serious family illness. I had already designated the Commander of my Bodyguard, E Kt Anthony Lloyd, as a Deputy Marshal and now promoted his nominated successor, E Kt Mke Steggles to Deputy Marshal leaving me with neither a Commander or Deputy Commander for the Bodyguard. As you will shortly see I have found two very willing volunteers to step up. I rehearse

this situation for you for two reasons. Firstly to demonstrate that if there is a keen and willing KT Mason in the Province, someone else has probably noticed as well. And secondly to thank all those Knights who have willingly, and without hesitation, taken office this year, and in the past, and continued to support me and the Sub Prior in the directing of this Province.

As usual this year the Sub Prior and I have visited all our Preceptories and many other Provinces, separately or together. I would particularly mention Northwich Preceptory No 558 who received me in November; half dressed and with my arm in a sling after having surgery on my broken wrist, and arranged for me to have baby food that I could eat with one hand. In the coming year there will be four Team Visits as indicated on today's Summons, including a Banner Dedication at St David 454 and a visit to Palestine 217 held over from this April after I was unexpectedly required to attend the Grand Lodge Investiture meeting.

We thank all the Officers and members of our Preceptories for their efforts.

In 2011 the Cheshire Bodyguard Preceptory No 578 surrendered its Warrant - a low point in this Province. Since 2013 I have been trying to find a way to bring back a Bodyguard Preceptory. I am delighted to report that in May, with a Dispensation from the Grand Master, I brought back onto the active roll The Preceptory of St George No 318 which had surrendered its Warrant in May 2017, and designated it our Bodyguard Preceptory with an initial membership of 30 Knights. I even managed to get myself elected as its Preceptor! I look forward to it finding an important role in the Province. It will keep its name which seemed to me to be a good one for a Bodyguard until one of my North Wales Knights said "You think so?". Sadly, 48 hours after that happy event I received back the Warrant of the Love & Friendship Preceptory No 272 after struggling for several years. It is currently in my study while I consider the possibility of a Past Preceptors' Daylight Preceptory.

Another unplanned change this coming season will be the venue for our Church Service. Since last July the incumbent at St James Christleton has left his church and his Church Wardens have made it clear that we are not welcome back. We will therefore be going to St Mary Astbury on 3rd July; a church where we have been previously. Provisionally for 2019 we plan to go into new territory at a church in North Wales. I do urge as many members of this Christian Order, together with their families, to attend this service.

The Charity Luncheon will be held here on 22nd July and I thank E Kt Walter Yule for all his work in organising this event in the past and E Kt David Heathcote for taking on the task this year. Application forms have been circulated and are available downstairs.

Following a very interesting talk at the Grand Master's Preceptory in London I decided that the Province would take steps to qualify as a sponsor of the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital Swift Appeal and I thank all those Preceptories who have already contributed and I encourage those who have not, to consider doing so. The current total raised is just over £2000. It would be good to have the Swift on the table at lunch here in 2019.

In October, at our Provincial Malta meeting, we will Install as a Knight of the Order a Templar Knight from Croes Newydd Preceptory No 603. I am sure that this will again be an excellent occasion and as it will not this year clash with the Craft Tercentenary I expect a very full Temple.

At Great Priory in May I was delighted to see rather more than the usual number of Cheshire & North Wales Knights honoured by the Grand Master.

E Kt Ian Cranston was promoted to Past Great Herald

E Kt Peter Butler, my Vice Chancellor, was appointed Past Deputy Great Sword Bearer E Kts Bill Caren, Stan Rawcliffe and Eric Porter were appointed Past Great Aides de Camp, and E Kt Graham Kyffin was appointed Past Great Warden of Regalia to mark the Sesquicentenary of Geoffroy de Bouillon Preceptory No 91.

I congratulate all these Knights and wish them well in their new ranks.

I also at this point thank and congratulate E Kt Fraser Fowlie for his year as Great Sword Bearer which brought great credit on himself and kudos to the Province. On one occasion he even carried the swords of two Grand Masters at the same meeting.

Christian Knight Templar Masonry continues to be a haven in an uncertain and increasingly violent world and I wish you all continuing enjoyment of our wonderful Order in the year to come. God bless you all.
